The Department of Respiratory Therapy at Georgia State University in Atlanta invites applications for Medical Director, a non-tenured track position at the rank of Clinical Professor.

Georgia State University is the Southeast's leading urban research institution with over 20 Schools and academic units and grants degrees in more than 250 programs. The Program in Respiratory Therapy is a fully accredited program with approximately 50 students per class. Bachelor and Master degree programs are offered in respiratory therapy, as well as an A.S. to B.S. degree bridge program. The Department of Respiratory Therapy is located in a large urban university and affiliated with major medical centers throughout the metro Atlanta area and United States.

Teaching, student laboratories and research laboratories in the Department of Respiratory Therapy are housed in the Parker H. Petit Science Center. Opened in March 2010, this 50,000 square-foot state of the art facility houses programs in biology, chemistry, nursing, nutrition, public health, respiratory therapy and the Georgia State University Neuroscience Institute. Applicants to the Medical Director/Clinical Professor position must be a board certified medical doctor, board certified in critical care medicine or pulmonary medicine. Applicants are required to have at least 10 years as a medical doctor with 5 years of experience in academia. Candidates must hold a medical license from the Georgia Composite Medical Board.

Salary is competitive and is commensurate with experience and qualifications. This is a part-time job (FTE of 0.20). This is a non-benefits eligible position.

Review of applications begin immediately, the search will remain open until the position is filled. The position will begin April, 2017.

Screening of applicants will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled.
